#### FIRM PROFILE

A full-service architecture practice executing major commissions for universities, museums, public agencies, real estate developers, and private land owners since its inception in 1979, Cooper, Robertson & Partners has designed a significant number of single-family residences – a primary focus of the firm. Many of these private houses are in the Hamptons on the East End of Long Island and in Westchester County, New York, as well as in Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Ohio, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, Wyoming, the Dominican Republic, and Jamaica. One of the firm's founding partners, Jaquelin T. Robertson, is among "The AD 100," Architectural Digest magazine's list of the top 100 architects and interior designers whose work has been featured in Architectural Digest over the past several years.

Other Cooper, Robertson projects include the design of two Founders' homes within the new resort community of WaterSound Beach in Florida, a country club and a bath and tennis club in the new community of New Albany outside Columbus, Ohio, as well as a private stable and indoor riding ring in Sharon, Connecticut. Also in Florida, the firm designed the golf clubhouse at Celebration and a private beach clubhouse in Vero Beach. Cooper, Robertson is currently working on the design of several apartment renovations in New York City and several private homes on the East End of Long Island, in Greenbrier, West Virginia, and in upstate New York.

Cooper, Robertson has received several honor awards for its house designs, including National American Institute of Architects Awards for two houses in East Hampton and for a historic house renovation in Manhattan. The firm has also been recognized for its mixed-use master plans and design of new communities. Cooper, Robertson received National AIA Awards for the master plan of WaterColor in Florida and the urban design of Battery Park City in New York, and received ULI Awards for Excellence for the design of the new communities of Celebration and WaterColor, both in Florida. Cooper, Robertson was the first firm to receive National AIA awards in both architecture and urban design in the same year.

Cooper, Robertson's residences reflect and respond to their local character, regional vernacular, topography, and climate. Often using locally produced materials in construction, we strive to build houses which not only provide comfort and lasting quality for years to come but which are responsibly "green" in everything from siting to the choice of materials and the heating, ventilation, and lighting systems.




